Provide limited/short-term financial assistance to renters or homeowners at imminent risk of homelessness due to the current economic crisis.

### **Community Action Partnership “Rent-Up” 544-6911x1011**

Works with homeless individuals and families who are attempting to enter the rental market, and need help learning how to successfully negotiate with housing providers. Upon completion of program clients maybe eligible to receive security deposit assistance.

Provides rental assistance to low-income families for affordable, decent, safe, and sanitary housing; recipients of the assistance receive a voucher to rent homes in the private market; the voucher covers a portion of the rent and the tenant is expected to pay the balance; office located at 1440 Guerneville Road in Santa Rosa.

### **HCA Funds: 544-6911**

Provides rent or security deposit. Priority to families with children, seniors and disabled.

### **Homeless Services Center: 525-0226**

Provides showers, laundry, phone, mail service, lockers, coffee and food in morning. M-F 6-11:30am, 1-2pm. 600 Morgan St., Santa Rosa.
