Join the 'Get Tested' HIV Anti-Stigma Campaign!

West County Health Centers and Food For Thought-Sonoma County AIDS Food Bank, are collaborating to pilot a provocative campaign focused in the West County to promote HIV testing and reduce HIV-related stigma. The "Get Tested" HIV Anti-Stigma Campaign will take place for one week November 3-9, 2013.

The campaign intends to challenge assumptions of "difference," and commonly held perceptions about who is HIV positive or at risk for exposure to HIV, as well as encourage everyone to be aware of their HIV status by being tested.

During the campaign week, participants will wear a T-shirt that reads, "Does this shirt make me look HIV+?" The back of the shirt carries the message: "Not positive? Get Tested."

If willing, these valiant T-shirt-wearing volunteers will post a photo of themselves along with comments about their experience on a campaign Facebook page (facebook.com/gettestedsonoma). They will also carry information about HIV, HIV-stigma and testing, as well as condoms to distribute to anyone they encounter who expresses interest in receiving them.

Volunteer participants will be drawn from the sponsoring agencies, local businesses, schools and community organizations.

It took 50 years to get the change we need in our health care system, but reform is finally here. Thanks to the Affordable Care Act, we have a once-in-ageneration opportunity to accelerate progress and dramatically increase the health and safety of all citizens: to give millions of people access to the healthcare services that they've always deserved.

Do you know that under the new healthcare law:

- Most people are required to have health insurance beginning in 2014
- The same health coverage must be offered regardless of medical history
- There are no annual or lifetime limits on essential health benefits
- Children can stay on a parent's plan until they turn 26
- Many no-cost preventive benefits are provided, like immunizations, contraception, diabetes and cancer screenings, and more.



Nutrition News with Nina Redman: Healthy Fries!

Baked Rosemary Sweet Potato Fries

FROM WENDY KOHATSU

2 large sweet potatoes/ or garnet yams, scrubbed

extra virgin olive oil, just enough to coat

1 teaspoon salt

2 tsp fresh rosemary leaves, minced

Other options for seasoning: smoked paprika, ground pepper, garlic powder, cinnamon, chili seasoning.

Directions:

Slice potatoes evenly into ¼ inch wedges—it's ok to leave skin on.

Preheat oven to 425 degrees.

In large bowl, mix potato slices with just enough olive oil to coat (any more will make the fries soggy, not crisp). Add salt and rosemary (or other spices) and toss. Place fries onto baking sheet IN SINGLE LAYER leaving space between fries.

Put in oven for 10-15 minutes and then flip them over. They should be evenly browned on the outside.

Place back in for 10-15 more minutes to brown other side.

Let cool for 5 minutes. Enjoy!

Continued from Page 1: West County Health Centers (WCHC) is actively preparing for the change in a number of ways. For many years, our staff has included employees who we call Access Coordinators.

Our Access Coordinators receive special training to assist our patients with applying for various types of assistance including our sliding scale program, Medi-Cal, CMSP, pharmacy assistance programs and Cal-Fresh (food stamps). We have recently more than doubled the number of Access Coordinators within our organization to seven and we have hired two new Ameri-Corps Workers who will conduct outreach, education, or other services to identify potential clients, and facilitate access/referral of clients to available health center services.

All of these employees, existing and new, are being trained to become Certified Enrollment Counselors for Covered California, the insurance marketplace that will be begin operating on October 1, 2103.

Roughly 40% of the 13,000 patients who receive services at West County Health Centers are currently uninsured. Our first

priority is to reach out to those people who we expect to become newly eligible for Medi-Cal. The planned Medi-Cal expansion will cover all eligible individuals and families with

annual incomes below 138% of the Federal Poverty level (\$15, 864 for an individual and \$26,952 for a family of 3). We estimate that over 2,500 WCHC patients will be eligible for these new benefits beginning on January 1, 2014.

Most of the remaining uninsured will be eligible to purchase their own coverage through Covered California and the majority will receive subsidies based on their income level. Our Access Coordinators will be available by appointment to assist any of our patients with the application process. We also plan to have group sign-ups and events at the health centers to explain the new options that will be available. HIV-related stigma and discrimination remains the foremost obstacle to effectively fighting the AIDS pandemic. It is estimated that one quarter of those living with HIV in Sonoma County do not know that they are infected, and that half of all new infections are transmitted by people who do not know their HIV status and thus unwittingly pass on the disease to others. HIV-stigma keeps people from being tested, and keeps many who are already living with HIV from getting the care, compassion, and support they need and deserve.
