Their daughter noticed the Latino and Chicano Literature Studies textbook Kathleen had been reading, and they started to talk about it – which created an intimacy and helped the family feel comfortable and trust her.

Kathleen told them she was learning about the Day of the Dead and wanted to celebrate it. The following week, during Kathleen's waiting room shift, the family came by and presented her with a Day of the Dead sticker.

For Kathleen, the Russian River Health Center is "like a family." Now 24 years old, Kathleen and her family have been patients there since she was a child. She credits Nurse Practitioner Surani for being a mentor to her in both her personal and professional life. Kathleen loves being part of the health center community and including others in this extended family. And she feels gratified that some patients intentionally schedule appointments when they know she'll be there so they can visit with her.

With nothing but high praise for the medical providers who have "listened to, consoled, and always been there" for her during her own challenging health journey, Maria Elena, like Judy Hess and Kathleen Grenham, is delighted to be able to "give back" to the health centers in her volunteer job as a waiting room host.
